Notes:

- The above Audited Standalone Financial Results of the Company for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2020 have been reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors of the Company in their meeting held on 29th June, 2020. The Statutory Auditors of the Company have carried out Audit of these results and the results are being published in accordance with Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.
- These results have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other recognised accounting practices and policies to extent applicable.
- The Company operates in a Single Business Segment-Fashion Apparels and Accessories including Intermediaries as per Ind AS 108 -Operating Segment. Accordingly, no further segment disclosures are required.
- 4 Effective 1st April 2019, the Company adopted Ind AS-116 "Leases" using modified retrospective approach. The Company is lessee for few rental contracts only and has no material impact on the financial results of the quarter and year ended.
- The figures for the quarter ended 31st March, 2020 and year ended 31st March, 2020 represent the difference between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the unaudited published year- to- date figures upto the third quarter of the financial year, which were subject to limited review.
- The Company had elected to exercise the option permitted under Section 115BAA of the Income Tax Act, 1961 as introduced by the Taxation Laws (Amendment) Ordinance Act, 2019. Accordingly, the company had recognised provision for taxation and re-measured its deferred tax liabilities basis the rate prescribed in the said section and the impact of tax expense of current year and re-measurement of deferred tax liabilities is recognised in these financial results.
- The Company is closely monitoring the situation of COVID-19. The Company has taken steps to ensure adequate safety and liquidity to meet its financial and other commitments. There is no significant impact on the results of 31st March 2020. Further, for the first quarter of FY 2020-21, being lockdown months, the revenues and profitability of the Company are likely to be adversely impacted and since the business situation is very dynamic, the Company is closely monitoring it. However, the impact assessment of COVID-19 is a continuing process given the uncertainties associated with its nature and duration, and accordingly the impact may be different from that estimated now.
- 8 During the quarter ended 31st March, 2020, the Company had allotted 4282 Equity shares of face value of Rs. 10/- each under Employee Stock Option Plan, 2013.
- 9 The figures for the corresponding previous period figures have been rearranged /regrouped, wherever necessary, to make them comparable.

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Statement of Standalone Financial Results of Bhartiya International Ltd("the Company"), for the quarter & financial year ended 31st March 2020 ("the Statement"), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, these Standalone Financial Results:

- The Parent Company alongwith some of its subsidiaries had elected to exercise the option permitted under Section 115BAA of the Income Tax Act, 1961 as introduced by the Taxation Laws (Amendment) Ordinance Act, 2019. Accordingly, the company had recognised provision for taxation and re-measured its deferred tax liabilities basis the rate prescribed in the said section and the impact of tax expense of current year and re-measurement of deferred tax liabilities is recognised in these financial results.
- The figures for the quarter ended 31st March, 2020 represent the difference between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the unaudited published year-to-date figures upto the third quarter of the financial year, which were subject to limited review.
- The Company is closely monitoring the situation of COVID-19. The Company has taken steps to ensure adequate safety and liquidity to meet its financial and other commitments. There is no significant impact on the results of 31st March 2020. Further, for the first quarter of FY 2020-21, being lockdown months, the revenues and profitability of the Company are likely to be adversely impacted and since the business situation is very dynamic, the Company is closely monitoring it. However, the impact assessment of COVID-19 is a continuing process given the uncertainties associated with its nature and duration, and accordingly the impact may be different from that estimated now.
- 8 During the quarter ended 31st March, 2020, the Company had allotted 4282 Equity shares of face value of Rs. 10/- each under Employee Stock Option Plan, 2013.
